- 6.1.3 (a) Constitutional Hill
Johannesburg notorious Old Fort Prison Complex, where thousands of people were brutally punished. Many political activists such as Mahatma Gandhi, Nelson Mandela and Walter Sisulu were detained here. Prime attractions include the Old Fort, Number Four, the infamous black men's prison; Women's Gaol museum and the adjacent Constitutional Court, the highest court in the country.✓✓
- (b) Enoch Sontonga Memorial
A large marble cube, in the middle of the park-like graveyard, is the memorial of the author of South African National Anthem, Nkosi Sikelele' iAfrica(God bless Africa), Enoch Sontonga.✓✓
- (c) Apartheid Museum
A chilling reminder of a not-too-distant past – the rise and fall of apartheid. Photographs, films and video shows, permanent and temporary display and voice-overs all immerse you in South Africa's issues of conflicts.✓✓
- D Freedom Square
The place where in 1956 the freedom charter, an important document formulated but the resistance leadership, was discussed in a public meeting, and signed. The document created a panic within the apartheid government and a draconian clampdown swept the country as a results. It is now a place of great social and political importance.✓✓
- (e) Avalon Cemetery
It is the last resting place of many heroes of the anti-apartheid struggle. Two major whites' activists, Joe Slovo and Helen Joseph are buried amongst many black South Africans.✓✓
